

City Provides Loans for Businesses Revolving Loan Fund (RLF)

The City of El Centro has two loan programs for businesses, a Revolving Loan Program (RLF) that provides loans ranging from \$5,000 to \$100,000, and a Micro-Enterprise Loan Program that provides loans from \$500 to \$5,000. The Revolving Loan Program was established to assist commercial and industrial growth by providing gap financing to businesses that will create or retain jobs.

Border Tactical Associates, Inc. was one business that came to the City of El Centro looking for funding assistance to accommodate a highly sophisticated ventilation system in the facility. Border Tactical Shooting Range is a state-of-the-art indoor shooting range with certified firearms instructors. It is a safe environment for instruction, training, practice, and competition, and offers classes for beginner non-shooters on how to safely handle and clean a firearm. Bill DuBois, owner of Border Tactical Associates, Inc. was able to hire additional staff due to the loan from the City and maintain his staff of knowledgeable, skilled, and experienced employees.

Summer Programs at the City of El Centro



The summer of 2016 was a very special experience for those that participated in the Summer Programs with all the many activities that took place. Swim lessons, open swim, Summer Camp which included the Half-Pint Camp, the Mini-Day Camp and the Sunrise Camp, Nothing but Net Basketball, Youth Attaining Leadership Skills Programs (YALS), the Summer Feeding Program, and the Summer Reading Program kept children busy for the last six weeks.

The summer program activities created great memories for the children, and they worked on self-esteem building exercises, indoor sports, and science experiments. The summer feeding program ensured that each child had something nutritious to eat and keep their energy up throughout the day. All the programs operated at maximum capacity throughout the summer and continue to grow each year. The City is appreciative of the partnership with Central Union High School for their ongoing support of the City's Aquatic Program. More than 300 people were registered for swim lessons during the summer session. The Aquatic Program also held daily open swim with 1,000 people visiting the pool.



The City was able to provide scholarships for swim lessons through funds available through the American Red Cross Centennial Campaign, LA84 Foundation, and Dippy Duck funds given by the IID to the City of El Centro. The children also received a presentation by the Imperial Valley Desert Museum.

During the summer programs, approximately 5,000 meals and snacks were served to children up to age 18 at the three locations, the El Centro Community Center, the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Sports Pavilion, and the El Centro Public Library. Graffiti Removal Program



The City of El Centro continues to take action to eradicate the graffiti that is blight in our city. Residents and visitors can report graffiti locations where incidents of vandalism with paint or marker have occurred. The City does require permission to enter private property to cover graffiti. The authorization form can be signed by the property owner or the owner's authorized representative. The authorization form will be kept on file for a period of one year from the date of signature in case there is future graffiti at the location.



The City of El Centro uses two basic colors to cover graffiti that closely matches the color of the building. If a property owner has matching paint, please contact the Economic Development office below and we can make those arrangements. The El Centro City Ordinance places responsibility for graffiti clean-up on property owners. However, due to the large volume of graffiti occurring in the city and the costs associated with the cleanup, the City of El Centro funded the Graffiti Removal Program. Since 2012, the City has responded to and painted over 3,000 incidents of graffiti. The City welcomes and encourages residents and businesses to become actively involved in graffiti abatement.
